Humanitarian Migrant Scholarship

For new students entering Grade 4
to Grade 12

INTRODUCTION

The Humanitarian Migrant Scholarship is open to new students who will be entering into Grade 4 to Grade 12 in 2020. Students must have entered Australia as a refugee, must be an Australian citizen or permanent resident of Australia and must demonstrate a keen interest in attending Launceston Church Grammar School and possess a commitment to learning and community service. In addition to the above, students will be required to provide examples in their introduction letter of how they will meet the General Scholarship Criteria set out below:

- Setting a good example in every respect inside and outside the classroom;
- Demonstrating positive School spirit;
- Willingly meeting all obligations as defined by staff;
- Being involved in and supporting school functions and activities;
- Being exemplary in their appearance and wearing of the School's uniform; and
- Making a full contribution to the School's co-curricular activities programme and to the general life of the School, and continue their enrolment at the School to the end of Grade 12.

Successful applicants will receive part remission of tuition fees (up to 50% concession) and is tenable until the end of Grade 12.

Scholarships will be reviewed after two years and will continue subject to satisfactory progress of the student, taking into account the student's School reports, feedback provided by various members of staff and the student's adherence to the General Scholarship Criteria.



APPLICATION PROCESS

Applications **must** include the following:

- Humanitarian Migrant Scholarship Application Form;
- Handwritten letter of introduction (by the student), addressed to the Headmaster, Mr Richard Ford. The letter is to include examples of how the student has or will meet the General Scholarship Criteria set out above and outline interests and specific academic/career goals for life beyond secondary school;
- Copy of the student's two school reports;
- Copy of the student's NAPLAN report(s); and
- Copy of certificates of achievement/accolades/ ICAS results etc, as appropriate (please limit to just a few awards).

Failure to include all documentation noted above may result in the application not being considered.

Applications will not be returned therefore we ask that only copies of reports and certificates be supplied. Material should be no larger than A4 size and should come stapled (please do not place material in a presentation folder).

Applications close at 5.00pm on Friday 31 May 2019.

- Students who are Australian citizens or permanent residents

SELECTION PROCESS

Applications will be shortlisted based on the documentation provided and criteria outlined above shortly after the closing date.

Shortlisted applicants will be invited to attend an interview with their parents to meet with the Headmaster and/or member of the School Executive.

All applicants will be informed of the outcome of their application once interviews have concluded.
