HOW IT WORKS

This is a wonderful, fun way to encourage reading in your school communities. Four to six students make up a team. Team members may be from Years 7 to 10 and can be of mixed Year Levels. The team's job is to read every title in the set list, answer quiz questions at the competition on all the titles, and present a time-limited, live, creative response to *three or more* titles in the set list. Group work must be done without expense or adult help. Schools run their own internal competition to select one team to represent their school in the interschool final.

INTER-SCHOOL FINAL

The inter-school final is judged by guest adjudicators. The inter-school competition will be held at St Patrick's College, Prospect on **Thursday 16 June.** Further details of arrangements for the Final will be sent to registered schools once registrations close.
