Launceston Grammar's 2024 Scholarship Programme

Launceston Grammar supports students, whom without assistance, may not be able to benefit from outstanding opportunities to be nurtured, challenged and inspired.

We value diversity amongst students and recognise this through the provision of a broad range of scholarships. There are a number offered at various year levels based on the assessment of specific criteria.

Eligibility

Applicants must be Australian citizens or Permanent Residents of Australia (evidence of residency must be provided).

International students on Student Visas are eligible to apply for the International Boarding Scholarship only. Please contact our **Head of Enrolments** at registrar@lgs.tas.edu.au for more details.

Launceston Grammar aims to provide excellent education and opportunity for all students.

How to apply

To apply for a Launceston Grammar Scholarship, you must follow these steps:

- Review the Scholarship Programme and identify the scholarships you are eligible to apply for.
- Scholarships are listed on pages **13 to 31**.
- Academic Scholarship: Students applying for the Board Academic Scholarship must register to complete an Academic Exam via the **Academic Scholarship Portal**, on the School website and submit all required documentation on or before this date. A registration fee applies.
- All Other Scholarships: Applicants must complete a Launceston Grammar Scholarship Application from the **School website: lgs.tas.edu.au**.
- Submit the required documents by the due date.

Birth Certificate or / Passport

A copy of the applicant's Birth certificate or Passport showing evidence of Australian citizenship or residency may be requested upon receipt of a Scholarship application.

School Reports

A copy of the applicant's most recent school report.

NAPLAN Report(s)

A copy of the applicant's NAPLAN report(s).

Certificates of Achievement or/Accolades

A copy of certificates of achievement/ accolades (please limit to a few) .

Additional Specialist Assessments

A copy of additional specialist assessments (e.g. speech pathology, learning plans if applicable).

Other Required Documents

If a scholarship requires additional documentation, the requirements will be listed in the Scholarship's description on pages [13-31](#). Other required documents should be labelled with the applicant's name.

Applying for Multiple Scholarships in 2024

Students may apply for multiple Scholarships.

Students applying for a Board Academic Scholarship will do so via the [Academic Scholarship Portal](#), and submit Launceston Grammar's Scholarship Application form for the *other* Scholarship.

Students applying for multiple other scholarships are required to complete only one application form to support their application/s and name the Scholarships being applied for on the front page of the Scholarship Application form.

Please ensure the criteria of each scholarship the student is applying for is addressed within that one application form.

How to Submit Your Application and Required Documents

Academic Scholarship applicants must register to sit the Board Academic Scholarship Exam and uploading any required documentation via the **Academic Scholarship Portal**, on the School website and submit all required documentation on or before this date.

Board Academic Scholarship Deadline!

Applicants must register to sit a Board Academic Scholarship Exam via the [Academic Scholarship Portal](#), and submit all required documentation on or before this date.

Friday 3 March 2023

Board Academic Scholarship Exam Day

More details will be provided to applicants following registration.

On or before Friday 10 March 2023

Deadline for All Other Scholarships!

Applicants must submit a Scholarship Application form and all required documentation on or before this date.

Before 28 April 2023

Launceston Grammar will notify students who have been shortlisted for an interview or audition.

April Onwards

All applicants will be informed of the outcome of their application once interviews have concluded.





Selection Process

Shortlisted applicants and their parents may be invited to attend an interview with the Principal and/or member of the School Executive.

Shortlisted Performing and Creative Arts and Bruce Fairfax Public Speaking applicants will be invited to audition in front of a panel.

Shortlisted Visual Arts applicants may be required to meet with the Head of Art to discuss their portfolio.

Scholarship Rebates

Successful applicants will receive part remission of tuition fees (up to 50% concession) with scholarships tenable until the end of Grade 12 unless noted otherwise.

Successful boarding applicants will receive part remission of boarding fees (up to 50% concession).

All applicants will be informed of the outcome of their application once interviews have concluded.

Scholarships are Competitive

Remember, applicants are competing for a limited number of available scholarships. It is the applicant's responsibility to ensure the application is complete and submitted on time. Failure to include all required documentation may result in the application not being considered. Launceston Grammar does not contact applicants to advise if an application is incomplete and/or missing.

Here's your checklist for success:

- Know the deadlines; refer to the Scholarship Timeline.
- Carefully review the eligibility and documentation required for ALL scholarships.
- For the Board Academic Scholarship, register to sit the Academic Exam via the [Academic Scholarship Portal](#) and submit all required documentation before the due date.
- For all *other* scholarships, complete a Scholarship Application and provide all required documentation before the due date.
- Check each document before you submit it.



Scholarship Review

Scholarships will be reviewed after two years and will continue subject to satisfactory progress of the student, taking into account the student's school reports, feedback provided by staff and the student's adherence to the Student Code of Conduct including:

- maintaining satisfactory academic progress
- adherence to the Scholarship Criteria:
 - Setting a good example in every respect inside and outside the classroom;
 - Demonstrating positive School spirit;
 - Willingly meeting all school obligations as defined by staff;
 - Being involved in and supporting school functions and activities;
 - Being exemplary in their appearance and wearing of the School's uniform; and
 - Making a full contribution to the School's co-curricular activities programme and to the general life of the School, and continue their enrolment at the School to the end of Grade 12.

If a scholarship has additional requirements, the requirements will be listed in the Scholarship's description.

Board Academic Scholarships

Open to *new and existing* students entering Grade 4 to 12.

Board Academic Scholarships will be awarded to students who achieve excellent academic performance in the annual Academic Scholarship examination.

The Board Academic Scholarship exam day is scheduled for Friday 3 March 2023.

The examination will be held on Launceston Grammar's Senior Campus (for students entering Grades 4 to 12 in 2024).

How To Apply

Students applying for the Board Academic Scholarship must register to complete the Academic exam via the [Academic Scholarship Portal](#) or before Monday 27 February 2023. Late applications will not be considered.

A non-refundable \$110+gst fee is payable on application.

More information regarding the Board Academic Scholarship exam will be provided to applicants following the closing date and prior to the exam day.

Registrations close: Monday 27 February 2023.

Board Academic Scholarship test day: Friday 3 March 2023.

Short-Listed Applicants

External applicants may be required to meet with the Principal and/or member of the School Executive at an agreed time following the examination.

General Excellence Scholarships

Open to new and existing students entering Grade 7 to 12.

Students will be required to demonstrate excellence in at least two of the following fields: Academic; Leadership and Community Service; the Arts (Performing Arts and/or Visual Arts); and Sport.

A number of Named Scholarships may be available under the General Excellence category. A successful applicant may be awarded one of the following:

- Brock Scholarship
- Harrap Scholarship
- WE Lawrence Memorial Scholarship

Alumni: Old Launcestonians' Association Scholarship

Open to new and existing students entering Grade 11 whose parent(s), grandparent(s) or near relative graduated from Launceston Grammar or Broadland House and who can demonstrate excellence and achievement in at least two of the following fields: Academic; Leadership and Community Service; and Sport in their Application form.

Additional Documentation Required

Alumni: Broadland House Old Girls Association Scholarship

Open to new and existing students entering Grade 11 whose parent(s), grandparent(s) or near relative graduated from Launceston Grammar or Broadland House and who can demonstrate excellence and achievement in at least two of the following fields: Academic; Leadership and Community Service; and Sport in their Application form.

Aviation Scholarships

Open to new students entering Grade 7 to 10.

Applicants will be required to demonstrate their ability and keen interest in further developing their skills in the areas of Aviation, Science, Technology, Engineering and/or Mathematics.

Additional Scholarship Conditions

Aviation Scholarships are offered on the condition that the Scholarship holder elects subjects consistent with the entry requirements for most university engineering or STEM-related degrees.

- Year 8 students will be required to choose at least two STEM-related electives each year. For example, Extension Mathematics, Extension Science, Applied Engineering, Technology, Robotics, Aviation Theory, or ICT Studies;
- over the course of their TCE, complete an aviation related Student Directed Inquiry (SDI), Mathematics Methods Foundation, Mathematics Methods, Physical Sciences Foundation, or Physical Sciences;

- participate in school STEM challenges, and provide mentoring and support for junior participants.

Successful applicants will be awarded the opportunity to participate in the construction of the full-sized RV- 12 aircraft currently underway at Launceston Grammar

Additional Documentation Required

- Within the Scholarship Application form, the Applicant's Letter must outline what the applicant hopes to achieve in the area of aviation.
- The Academic Reference should be provided from the applicant's Science, Technology, Engineering or Mathematics teacher.
- Portfolio of examples showcasing the applicant's engagement with STEM and the design process. The portfolio may demonstrate competence in any of the following areas: Mechanical / structural / marine / aeronautical engineering, Computer assisted design, Robotics, Coding and or Computer Science.

Indigenous Scholarships

Open to new students entering Grades 4 to 12 who identify as Indigenous or Aboriginal.

Applicants will be required to demonstrate excellence and achievement in at least two of the following fields: Academics; Leadership and Community Service; and Sport in their [Application form](#).

Migrant and Refugee Scholarships

Open to new students entering Grades 4 to 12.

Applicants will be required to demonstrate excellence and achievement in at least two of the following fields: Academics; Leadership and Community Service; and Sport in their Application form.

Scholarships are open to students who are Australian citizens, permanent residents or students who hold Humanitarian Migrant status visa.

Additional Documentation Required

This is a Means-tested Scholarship, a Financial Information Form and relevant documentation is required. Evidence of the applicant's Visa status is required.





Means-tested Scholarships

Open to new and existing students entering Grades 4 to 12.

Applicants who demonstrate excellence and achievement who would not under any other circumstances be able to afford a Launceston Grammar education.

Applicants will be required to demonstrate excellence and achievement in at least two of the following fields: Academic; Leadership and Community Service; and Sport in their Application form.

A number of Named Scholarships are available under the General Excellence category. A successful applicant may be awarded one of the following:

- Christopher 'Gus' Green OAM Scholarship
- GL Stubs Educational Trust Scholarship
- Gordon Hughes Scholarship
- ML Rooney and HV Jones Scholarship
- Richard Miles Scholarship

Additional Documentation Required

This is a Means-tested Scholarship, a Financial Information Form and relevant documentation is required.

Stephen Norris Scholarship

Open to new or existing students entering Grade 10 or Grade 11.

The Stephen Norris Scholarship will be awarded to a new or current student who is a migrant community member and an Australian citizen or permanent resident of Australia.

The scholarship recognises a student with a high level of application to study and who makes a full contribution to extra-curricular activities. A family's financial circumstance will also be taken into account.

Students must possess a commitment to learning, academic achievement and community service.

Additional Documentation Required

This is a Means-tested Scholarship, a Financial Information Form. Information regarding the applicant's visa/residency status should be provided.

Young Entrepreneur Scholarship

Open to new students entering Grades 7 to 11.

To encourage young people who are entrepreneurially minded, creative, inventive and courageous.

Launceston Grammar nurture student's entrepreneurial ideas through a system of adult mentoring for our Young Entrepreneurs. Entrepreneurship can occur in any area of endeavour, including but not limited to: Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths (STEM), Business, Social Sciences or Sustainability.

Additional Documentation Required

Within the Scholarship Application form, the Applicant's Letter must address the following points:

- What is your dream? How will it change the world?
- What will you develop and how will it benefit others?
- What are your specific or particular areas of interest or passion?
- What, if anything, have you already achieved as an entrepreneur?

Performing and Creative Arts - Music Scholarships

Open to new and existing students entering Grades 7 to 12.

Launceston Grammar aims to assist students to maximise their musical education by offering scholarships to students who demonstrate a high level of musicianship.

Applicants must show evidence of outstanding musical achievement or potential in one of four areas:

- Strings
- Choral
- Brass/Woodwind
- Contemporary Music

As a guide, the School has set minimum levels of prior achievements on AMEB or Trinity College examinations, or equivalent, for audition. These are as follows:

Theory	Performance	School Grade of Entry
Grade 2 AMEB	Grade 3 AMEB	Grade 7
Grade 3 AMEB	Grade 4 AMEB	Grade 9
Grade 4 AMEB	Grade 5-6 AMEB	Grade 11

Additional Documentation Required

- Within the Scholarship Application form, please ensure one reference is included from the applicant's musical coach.
- a USB containing a video recording of the applicant's performance on their chosen instrument(s) (musical or vocal).

Short-Listed Applicants

Shortlisted applicants may be required to perform an audition in front of a panel of judges. Applicants should come prepared to play two contrasting pieces on their chosen instrument/s or on each of their chosen instruments, if more than one (maximum of two pieces).

The audition will also include a sight-reading test, an aural test, and a short interview with the panel. Applicants will be assessed on their presentation, program choice, preparedness, potential, engagement, and finesse.

Additional Scholarship Requirements

Scholarships are offered on the condition that the scholarship holder:

- maintains a high level of application to the subject Music
- maintains a high level of achievement in academic studies
- includes Music as a year-long elective in Grades 8-10
- chooses Music in either Grade 11 or 12; and
- makes a full contribution to the School's extra-curricular Music programme and participates in School Productions.

Andrew Gordon Music Scholarship

Open to new and existing students entering Grades 11.

A generous donation made by the late Mr Andrew Gordon has enabled the prestigious Andrew Gordon Music Scholarship to be established.

As a guide, the School has set minimum levels of previous achievements on AMEB or Trinity College examinations, or equivalent, for audition. These are as follows:

Theory	Performance	School Grade of Entry
Grade 4 AMEB	Grade 5-6 AMEB	Grade 11

Additional Documentation Required

- Within the Scholarship Application form, please ensure one reference is included from the applicant's musical coach
- a USB containing a video recording of the applicant's performances on their chosen instrument/s (musical or vocal)

Short-Listed Applicants

Shortlisted applicants may be required to perform an audition in front of a panel of judges. Applicants should come prepared to play two contrasting pieces on their chosen instrument/s or on each of their chosen instruments, if more than one (maximum of two pieces).

The audition will also include a sight-reading test, an aural test and a short interview with the panel. Applicants will be assessed on their presentation, program choice, preparedness, potential, engagement, and finesse.

Additional Scholarship Requirements

Scholarships are offered on the condition that the scholarship holder:

- maintains a high level of application to the subject Music
- maintains a high level of achievement in academic studies
- includes Music as a year-long elective in Grades 8-10

- makes a full contribution to the School's extra-curricular Music programme and participates in School Productions.



Performing and Creative Arts-Drama Scholarships

Open to new and existing students entering Grades 7 to 12.

Applicants will be required to demonstrate artistic excellence in Drama.

Short-Listed Applicants

Upon receipt of the application, the Head of Enrolments' Office will contact the students and provide them with the audition task. This must be filmed and submitted on a USB by the due date provided by the Head of Enrolments' Office to be considered for an audition.

Shortlisted applicants will be required to attend an audition where they will be asked to perform one improvised piece on a subject provided by the auditioning panel. Applicants will be assessed on their: communication of mood, meaning of text; use of body and voice to communicate character; polished standard of performance; use of costume; character moves; characterisation; and simple props.

Additional Scholarship Requirements

Scholarships are offered on the condition that the scholarship holder:

- maintains a high level of application to the subject Drama
- maintains a high level of achievement in academic studies
- includes Drama as a year-long elective in Grades 8-10
- chooses Drama in either Grade 11 or 12; and
- makes a full contribution to the School's extra-curricular Drama programme and participates in School Productions.

Performing and Creative Arts-Dance Scholarships

Open to new and existing students entering Grades 7 to 12.

Applicants will be required to demonstrate artistic excellence in Dance.

Short-Listed Applicants

Upon receipt of the application, the Head of Enrolments' Office will contact the students and provide them with the audition task. This must be filmed and submitted on a USB by the due date provided by Head of Enrolments' Office to be considered for an audition.

Shortlisted applicants will be required to attend an audition where they will be asked to perform one improvised piece on a subject provided by the auditioning panel. Applicants will be assessed on their ability to communicate choreographic intent; use of stimulus; show quality/dynamic of movement; polished standard of presentation.

Additional Scholarship Requirements

Scholarships are offered on the condition that the scholarship holder:

- maintains a high level of application to the subject Dance
- maintains a high level of achievement in academic studies
- includes Dance as a year-long elective in Grades 8-10
- chooses Dance in either Grade 11 or 12; and
- makes a full contribution to the School's extra-curricular Dance Programme and participates in School Productions.





Performing and Creative Arts-Poimena (Visual Art) Scholarships

Open to new and existing students entering Grades 7 to 12.

Applicants will be required to demonstrate artistic excellence in visual arts, photography, painting, film making, media art and/or sculpture.

Additional Documentation Required

- Applicants are required to submit a portfolio of their work on a USB. Portfolios will be reviewed by a panel and will be considered based on their originality, diversity, technical skill and emergence of a personal voice or vision.

Short-Listed Applicants

Shortlisted applicants will be required to attend an interview with a member of School Executive.

Additional Scholarship Requirements

Scholarships are offered on the condition that the scholarship holder:

- maintains a high level of application to the subject Visual Art;
- maintains a high level of achievement in academic studies;
- includes Visual Art as a year-long elective in Grades 8-10;
- chooses Visual Art in either Grade 11 or 12; and
- makes a full contribution to the School's extra-curricular programme and in particular to the Visual Art extra-curricular programme.

Bruce Fairfax Public Speaking and Debating Scholarships

Open to new and existing students entering Grades 7 to 12.

Applicants must have a demonstrated ability in public speaking and debating and possess a keen interest in developing these skills further.

Bruce Fairfax served on staff at Launceston Grammar from 1989 to 2016 and throughout his time at the School coached hundreds of students in Public Speaking and Debating.

Successful applicants will be required to participate in the School's inter-house and inter-school debating and public speaking season, support their peers and junior debaters and participate in at least two competitions annually.

Additional Documentation Required

- Within the Scholarship Application form, please provide one written reference obtained from the applicant's debating or public speaking coach or tutor.
- Within the Scholarship Application form's Letter to the Principal, applicant's reasons for applying for the Scholarship including what the applicant hopes to achieve through participating in public speaking and debating at Launceston Grammar.

Short-Listed Applicants

Shortlisted applicants may be required to perform an audition in front of a panel of judges.

Additional Scholarship Requirements

Scholarships are offered on the condition that the scholarship holder:

- participates in the inter-house and inter-school debating and public speaking season
- provides leadership and support to their peers and junior debaters; and
- annually participates in at least two public speaking competitions.



Regional Boarding Scholarships

Open to new and existing students entering Grade 5 to 12.

Family must reside in regional areas of Tasmania and mainland states; and must be prepared to board on a full-time basis.

Applicants must demonstrate a strong commitment to their studies and achievement in at least two of the following fields: Academic; Leadership and Community Service and Sport in their Application form.

Additional Documentation Required

This is a Means-tested Scholarship, a Financial Information Form and relevant documentation is required.
